INTRODUCTION

This report reflects data collected from libraries based on their last fiscal year completed between December 31, 2013 and October 15, 2014. That is, the most recent data collected is from the first two quarters of 2014. The data is only as good as the reports that libraries voluntarily provided to the Vermont Department of Libraries. Because not all libraries submit data each year, the totals and percentages reported here may be somewhat incongruent with the reports from prior years. Manchester Community Library did not submit data this year which particularly has had an impact on "Total Payroll Expenditures."

Here are some statewide indicators comparing FY2014 with the previous year's report:¹

- Libraries increased the total number of hours they are open to the public by 11 hours per week. (FY2013: 4,827.2 / FY2014: 4,838.0), (0.22%).
- **Visits to libraries decreased** 406,350 (FY2013: 3,624,504 / FY2014: 3,218,154), (-11.21%).
- Local tax appropriations increased by \$530,467 (FY2013: \$16,835,880 / FY2014: \$17,366,347), (3.15%).
- Other income (fundraising, donations, and interest income, etc.) increased by \$119,185 (FY2013: \$3,775,852 / FY2014: \$3,895,037), (3.16%).
- Total income from all sources increased by \$533,810 (FY2013: \$20,727,574 / FY2014: \$21,261,384), (2.58%).
- Libraries received more grant money this year. The total grant funds received increased by \$188,432 (FY2013: \$411,035 / FY2014: \$599,467), (45.84%).
- Total payroll expenditures (salary + benefits) decreased by \$166,719 (-1.12%), (FY2013: \$14,848,070 / FY2014: \$14,681,351).
- ✤ Book (print) expenditures decreased \$79,954 (-5.52%) (FY2013: \$1,449,638 / FY2014: \$1,369,684) with an overall decrease in total collection expenditures (all media) of \$16,565 (FY2013: \$2,322,263 / FY2014: \$2,305,698), (-0.85%).
- ♦ Other expenditures increased. These expenditures (utilities, fuel, maintenance, etc.) increased by \$528,012 (FY2013: \$4,779,521 / FY2014: \$5,307,533), (11.05%).
- ✤ With lower print book expenditures, libraries decreased the number of physical books in their collections by 78,172 (FY2013: 2,789,630 / FY2014: 2,711,458), (-2.80%).
- The number of registered borrowers decreased by 26,816 (-8.21%) (FY2013: 326,507 / FY2014: 299,691).
- ✤ Total reported circulation of all items decreased by 203,903 (FY2013: 4,517,493 / FY2014: 4,313,590). (-4.51%)

- Libraries offered 2,358 more programs this year (FY2013: 20,897/ FY2014: 23,255), (11.28%). Program attendance increased by 9,111 (FY2013: 335,731 / FY2014: 344,842), (2.71%).
- Libraries reduced the number of computers for public use by 18 (FY2013: 1,070 / FY2014: 1,052), (-1.68%). There was an increase of 652 (4.39%) in the number of weekly computer sessions (FY2013: 14,868 / FY14: 15,475), and an increase of 2,694 in annual computer training sessions (FY2013: 36,864 / FY2014: 39,558).
- Volunteer hours per week increased by 164 hours (5.00%) (FY2013: 3,277 / FY2014:3,441).

It is thanks to the continuing effort of local librarians that we are able to publish this *Vermont Public Library Statistics, FY2014 Annual Report.* Vermont has 183 public libraries. This report includes statistics submitted by 163 public libraries and is arranged by population served and alphabetically by town. As previously mentioned, data is for individual library fiscal years ending somewhere between December 31, 2013 and October 15, 2014.

Using the data

This publication is designed to help librarians, library trustees, and local communities assess how well their libraries are performing, identify areas for improvement, and make plans for the future. As such, librarians and trustees may want to:

- Identify trends over time such as increases or decreases in circulation, expenses or income;
- Compare their own library's data to that of libraries serving populations or having budgets of similar size;
- Use this data to inform decision-makers and the community about the value and importance of their public library.

When reviewing a library's statistics in relation to those of other libraries, it is crucial to consider context – community demographics, changes in the local economy, events or situations particular to the community, and changes in library services and programs. It is important to note that Vermont's public libraries and the towns they serve vary a great deal. Some libraries *officially* serve relatively small populations, but *actually* serve larger surrounding areas or significant seasonal populations. Some libraries receive large tax appropriation, while others serving a similar-sized population rely on interest from endowments or local fund-raising for the bulk of their operating costs. Some "community" libraries (joint school-public libraries) report tax support from both municipal and school sources, while others report only tax support from municipal sources.

It is also important to remember that libraries may count activities and transactions in different ways, and differing local practices and policies have bearing on resulting statistics. For example, some libraries count the number of visitors each day to achieve an annual count; others determine the number of annual visits using a sampling method, making a concerted effort to count daily visitors only during selected weeks in the year. Other factors that have an impact on a library's total circulation are: the number of hours the library is open, loan periods (one month, three weeks, two weeks, etc.), methods of renewal of library materials (online, by phone, in-person), the increased use of digital resources like e-books and downloadable audiobooks and the inclusion (or exclusion) of uncatalogued paperbacks and other materials in the count.

National sources concerning statistics

These statistics are but one tool in an ongoing self-evaluation process in which all libraries should engage. Good resources for public libraries include: *Say It With Data: A Concise Guide to Making Your Case and Getting Results* (American Library Association, 2014) and *Measuring the Networked Nonprofit: Using Data to Change the World* (JosseyBass, 2012).

Librarians interested in exploring the performance of their children's services will find *Dynamic Youth Services Through Outcome-based Planning and Evaluation* (American Library Association, 2006) helpful. All of these titles are available through interlibrary loan from the Department of Libraries.

How this publication is organized

The first chart (p. 13) serves as an index, listing all the libraries alphabetically by town name, and including: library name, population served, facility square footage, number of hours open weekly in winter, and fiscal year end date.

Successive charts are arranged first by population groups and then alphabetically by town name. If a library receives tax funds from more than one town, those populations have been combined as the library's "population served." If there is more than one library in a town, the town's population may be divided among the libraries. For more information, see "Libraries with Adjusted Populations" (p. 11).

The population categories are:

- Public libraries serving populations over 5,000
- Public libraries serving populations between 2,500-4,999
- Public libraries serving populations between 1,000-2,499
- > Public libraries serving populations under 1,000

Each population category contains the following charts:

- Staffing, square footage of building, hours open
- > Income for the fiscal year (ending somewhere between 12/31/13 and 10/15/14)
- Expenditures for the fiscal year (ending somewhere between 12/31/13 and 10/15/14)
- Holdings of books
- Holdings of other materials
- Services: hours open weekly in winter, registered borrowers, visits, reference transactions
- Circulation and interlibrary loan
- Programming and outreach
- > Computers and computer-based services

FACTS ABOUT VERMONT PUBLIC LIBRARIES, FY2014

There are 183 public libraries. 163 libraries submitted data this year.

- > Vermont ranks first in the nation in the number of libraries per capita.
- > There is also a bookmobile that serves Franklin and Grand Isle counties.
- Three public libraries have branches: Aldrich Public (Barre), Ilsley Public (Middlebury) and Quechee; four have bookmobiles: Cobleigh Public (Lyndon), Milton Public, South Burlington Community, and Swanton Public.
- Public library service is available locally or by contract (formal or informal) with another town's library for 604,908 citizens. Vermont's total estimated population is 626,630¹

Many public libraries exclusively serve the town or city in which they are located. Others serve more than one town, and the populations are added together to obtain the "population served." This is the case with: Barre City and Town, Jericho and Underhill, Newport City and Town, and St. Albans City and Town. In Essex, the total town population is included for the Essex Free Library. The Brownell Library in Essex Junction uses only the official population for the village of Essex Junction.

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING POPULATIONS OVER 5,000

Thirty-one (31) libraries serve populations over 5,000. Statistics for branch libraries in East Barre, and East Middlebury are also included with the libraries in Barre, and Middlebury respectively. Statistics for the bookmobile serving Franklin and Grand Isle counties, which have populations in excess of 5,000, are not included. Several larger libraries serve more than one town, and the unduplicated populations of all of the towns providing tax support are included as the population served and are used for calculating per capita values. The South Burlington Community Library is a "community library" serving as both public and high school library.

Some significant facts:

- These libraries serve 335,176 people. 53.49% of Vermonters live within these library service areas.
- These libraries are open a total of 1,385.0 hours a week, which represents 28.63% of the total time libraries are open in the state as a whole
- There are the equivalent of 96.69 full time librarians working in these libraries, which represents 45.78% of the librarian time spent in the entire state.
- Volunteers give 1,395.5 hours of their time to these libraries, 40.56% of all the volunteer hours donated to libraries in the state.
- These libraries received a total of \$10,933,820 in tax support from their Towns. This is 62.96% of the total tax revenues provided all the libraries in the state.
- These libraries raised \$1,591,780 in other funds, 14.56% of their funds beyond the tax revenues supplied. This includes fund-raising, donations, investment income or other forms of giving. This represents 40.87% of the statewide total.
- These libraries account for approximately \$12,525,600 or 58.91% of the total expenditures by libraries in the state.
- 1,364,956 or 45.07% of the items owned by Vermont public libraries are held in these libraries.
- There were 2,060,650 visits (64.03% of statewide visits) to these public libraries. These libraries also account for 2,711,661 or 62.86% of the items circulated in the state.
- In 2013-2014 these libraries held 10,686 programs, at which there were 187,027 attendees. Statewide, this represents 45.95% of the programs and 54.24% of the attendance.
- 28 of these libraries report a subscription to the Vermont Online Library.
- 31 of these libraries report providing public wireless access.

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING POPULATIONS BETWEEN 2,500 AND 4,999

Forty-one (41) libraries serve populations between 2,500 and 4,999. The Fairfax Community Library is a "community" library, serving as both a public and a school library. Statistics for the branch library in Hartford/Wilder are included with Hartford/Quechee.

Manchester Community Library is usually included in this group, but did not submit data for FY14. Because this is one of the larger libraries in the state, there may be some incongruities in comparison to data from past years' reports.

Some significant facts:

- 133,235 (21.26%) of Vermonters live within these library service areas.
- These libraries are open a total of 1,368.0 hours a week, which represents 28.28% of the total time libraries are open in the state.
- There are the equivalent of 48.43 full time librarians working in these libraries, which represents 22.93% of the librarian time spent in the entire state.
- Volunteers give 821.5 hours of their time to these libraries weekly, 23.88% of all the volunteer hours donated to libraries in the state.
- These libraries received a total of \$3,512,896 in tax support from their towns. This is 20.23% of the total tax revenues provided all the libraries in the state.
- These libraries raised another \$1,110,911 (31.62%) in other funds beyond the tax revenues including fundraisers, donations, investment income and other forms of giving. This represents 28.52% of the statewide total of additional funds raised.
- These libraries had expenditures of \$4,703,879 or 21.10% of funds spent by libraries in the state.
- 749,783 or 24.76% of the physical items owned by Vermont public libraries are held in these libraries.
- There were 605,649 (18.82% of the statewide total) visits to these public libraries.
- These libraries also account for 900,365 (20.87%) of the items circulated in the state.
- In 2013-2014 these libraries held 5,008 programs, which attracted 74,102 attendees. Statewide, this represents 21.54% of the programs and 21.49% of the attendance.
- 34 of these libraries reported having a subscription to the Vermont Online Library.
- 40 of these libraries report providing public wireless access.

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING POPULATIONS BETWEEN 1,000 AND 2,499

Seventy-six (76) libraries serve populations between 1,000 and 2,499 in Vermont. Cavendish Fletcher Community Library, Chittenden Public Library, South Hero Community Library and G.M. Kelly Community Library (Wolcott) are "community libraries" serving as both public and school libraries.

Some significant facts:

- 112,245 (17.91%) of Vermonters live within these library service areas.
- These libraries are open a total of 1,682.0 hours a week, which represents 34.77% of the total time libraries are open in the state.
- There are the equivalent of 43.39 full time librarians working in these libraries, which represents 20.54% of the librarian FTE in the state.
- Volunteers give 865.3 hours of their time to these libraries weekly, 25.15% of all the volunteer hours donated to libraries in the state.
- These libraries received a total of \$2,267,489 in tax support from their Towns. This is 13.06% of the total tax revenues provided all the libraries in the state.
- These libraries raised another \$1,008,711 (44.49%) in other funds beyond the tax revenues including fundraisers, donations, investment income and other forms of giving. This represents 25.90% of the statewide total of additional funds raised.
- These libraries had expenditures of \$3,655,512 or 16.40% of funds spent by libraries in the state.
- 741,151 or 24.47% of the items owned by Vermont public libraries are held in these libraries.
- There were 451,365 (14.03% statewide) visits to these public libraries. These libraries also account for 560,360 (12.99%) of the items being circulated in the state.
- In 2013-2014 these libraries held 6,344 programs, at which there were 66,575 attendees. Statewide, this represents 27.28% of the programs and 19.31% of the attendance.
- 44 of these libraries report a subscription to the Vermont Online Library.
- 68 of these libraries report providing wireless access.

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING POPULATIONS UNDER 1,000

There are thirty-five (35) libraries serving towns with populations under 1,000 in Vermont. However, 11 of these libraries did not report any information to the Department of Libraries. Several libraries in this population range serve seasonal populations (e.g., Greensboro, Middletown Springs, North Hero, Peacham) which makes their populations swell far beyond 1,000 at certain times of the year and may account for their proportionally higher numbers. Lowell Community, Stamford Community, Vershire Community, Walden Community and Woodbury Community Libraries are "community libraries" serving as both public and school libraries.

The West Hartford Library was closed for all of FY14 while a new building was under construction.

Some significant facts:

- 24,870 (3.97%) of Vermonters live within these library service areas.
- These libraries are open a total of 403.0 hours a week, which represents 8.33% of the total time libraries are open in the state as a whole.
- There are the equivalent of 22.70 full time librarians working in these libraries, which represents 10.75% of the librarian time spent in the entire state.
- Volunteers give 254.4 hours of their time to these libraries weekly, 7.39% of all the volunteer hours donated to libraries in the state.
- These libraries received a total of \$652,142 in tax support from their Towns. This is 3.84% of the total tax revenues provided all the libraries in the state.
- These libraries raised an additional \$183,635 in other funds, whether through fundraisers, donations, investment income or other forms of giving. This represents 4.71% of the statewide total and means that they took it upon themselves to raise an additional 28.16% of their funds beyond the tax revenues supplied.
- These libraries account for approximately \$838,358 or 3.76% of funds spent by libraries in the state.
- 172,890 or 5.71% of the items owned by Vermont public libraries are held in these libraries.
- There were 100,490 (3.12% statewide) visits to these public libraries. These libraries also account for 141,204 (3.27%) items being circulated in the state.
- In 2013-2014 these libraries held 1,217 programs, at which there were 17,138 attendees. Statewide, this represents 5.23% of the programs and 4.97% of the attendance.
- 17 of these libraries report a subscription to the Vermont Online Library.
- 23 of these libraries report providing wireless access.
