INTRODUCTION

This report reflects data collected from libraries, based on their last fiscal year completed between December 31, 2010 and October 15, 2011. However, based upon local preferences, there are a variety of fiscal years employed. Most libraries use a calendar year as their fiscal year. Most other libraries close their fiscal year on June 30. (Only four libraries use the Federal fiscal year, beginning October 1.) That is, the most recent data collected is from the first two quarters of 2011.

Here are some statewide indicators comparing FY2011 with the previous year's report:¹

- ❖ **Libraries increased the total number of hours** they are open to the public by 127 hours per week. (FY2010: 4,667.5 / FY2011: 4,794.6) This is a 2.72% change.
- ❖ **Visits to libraries changed** by -95,212 (FY2010: 3,787,784 / FY11: 3,692,572), a -2.51% change from last year.
- ❖ **Local tax appropriations changed** by \$734,574 (FY2010: \$15,719,286 / FY2011: \$16,453,860), a 4.67% change. **Other income** (fundraising, donations, and interest income, etc.) changed by -\$2,604,456 (FY2010: \$5,882,023 / FY2011: \$3,277,567), a -44.28% change. **Total income from all sources changed** by -8.03% or -\$1,734,802 (FY2010: \$21,602,309 / FY2011: \$19,867,507).
- ❖ **Libraries received less grant money** this year. The total grant funds received changed by -104,934 (FY2010: \$749,873 / FY2011: \$644,939), a -13.99% change.
- ❖ **Total payroll expenditures (salary + benefits) changed** by \$613,909 or 4.49%. (FY2010: \$13,660,204 / FY2011: \$14,274,113.)
- ❖ **Book (print) expenditures changed** by -77,915 (-4.88%) (FY2010: \$1,598,006 / FY2011: \$1,520,091) and this was mirrored in a **change in total collection expenditures** (all media) of -\$32,506 (FY2010: \$2,316,393 / FY2011: \$2,283,887). (a 1.40% decrease).
- ❖ **Other expenditures decreased slightly.** These expenditures (utilities, fuel, maintenance, etc.) changed by -\$153,281 (FY2010: \$4,739,750 / FY2011: \$4,586,469). (-3.23%)
- ❖ **With lower book expenditures, libraries decreased the number of books:** -63,496 (FY2010: 2,941,222 / FY2011: 2,877,726) in their collections, a -2.16% decrease.
- ❖ **The number of registered borrowers declined by 18,895** (-5.40%) (FY2010: 349,769 / FY2011: 330,874), which may be the result of efforts by many libraries to purge their patron records to meet standards.
- ❖ **Total circulation of all items increased modestly** by 142,956 (FY2010: 4,691,340 / FY2011: 4,834,296), a 3.05% increase.
- ❖ **Libraries offered 220 fewer programs** (FY2010: 21,195/ FY2011: 20,975) this year, a -1.04% decrease. **Program attendance, however, increased** by 11,114 (FY2010: 341,678 / FY2011: 352,792), a 3.25% increase.

- ❖ **Libraries added 55 computers for public use** (FY2010: 957 / FY2011:1,012), a 5.75% increase. There was a 6.29% **decrease in the number of weekly computer sessions**. Libraries reported a decrease of -1156 sessions per week (FY2010: 18,372 / FY2011: 17,216).
- ❖ **Volunteer hours were essentially unchanged from last year**, (FY2010: 3,436 / FY2011: 3,435).

On visits to their local library, citizens find trained staff ready and willing to assist, online and print resources to answer their questions and facilitate learning, and connections to the wider world.

It is thanks to the continuing effort these librarians and library staff that we are able to publish this *Vermont Public Library Statistics, 2012 Annual Report*. This report includes statistics submitted by 183 public libraries and is arranged by population served and alphabetically by town. As previously mentioned, data is for individual library fiscal years ending somewhere between December 31, 2010 and October 15, 2011.

Using the data

This publication is designed to help librarians, library trustees, and local communities assess how well their libraries are performing, identify areas for improvement, and make plans for the future. As such, librarians and trustees may want to:

- Identify trends over time such as increases or decreases in circulation, expenses or income;
- Compare their own library's data to that of libraries serving populations or having budgets of similar size;
- Use this data to inform decision makers and the community about the value and importance of their public library.

When reviewing a library's statistics in relation to those of other libraries, it is crucial to consider context – community character, library history, and tradition. It is important to note that Vermont's public libraries and the towns they serve vary a great deal. Some libraries *officially* serve relatively small populations, but *actually* serve larger surrounding areas or significant seasonal populations. Some libraries receive large tax appropriation, while others serving a similar population rely on interest from endowments for the bulk of their operating costs. Some "community" libraries (joint school-public libraries) report tax support from both municipal and school sources, while others report only tax support from municipal sources.

It is also important to remember that libraries may count activities and transactions in different ways, and differing local practices and policies have bearing on resulting statistics. For example, some libraries count the number of visitors each day to achieve an annual count; others determine the number of annual visits using a sampling method, making a concerted effort to count daily visitors only during selected weeks in the year. Other factors that have an impact on a library's total circulation are: the number of hours the library is open, loan periods (one month, three weeks, two weeks, etc.), methods of renewal of library materials (online, by phone, in-person), and the inclusion (or exclusion) of uncataloged paperbacks, puzzles, or other realia in the count.

National sources concerning statistics

These statistics are but one tool in an ongoing self-evaluation process in which all libraries should engage. Regardless of size, a useful source of further information on the collection and use of public library statistics is *Output Measures for Public Libraries: A Manual of Standardized Procedures*, 2nd ed. (American Library Association, 1987).

Some of the information included in this report is broken down by age (adult and juvenile) in response to requests from librarians. Librarians interested in exploring the performance of their children's services will find *Output Measures for Public Library Service to Children: A Manual of Standardized Procedures* (American Library Association, 1992) helpful. Both of these manuals are available through interlibrary loan from the Department of Libraries.

Libraries wishing to find comparative statistics from peer libraries around the country may do so by using the Institute of Museum and Library Services' "Compare Public Libraries" tool, available at <http://harvester.census.gov/impls/compare/index.asp>.

How this publication is organized

The format of this report is similar to those published previously. The first chart (p. 13) serves as an index, listing all the libraries alphabetically by town name, and including: library name, population served, facility square footage, number of hours open weekly in winter, and fiscal year end date.

Succeeding charts are arranged first by population groups and then alphabetically by town name. If a library receives tax funds from more than one town, those populations have been combined as the library's population served. If there is more than one library in a town, the town's population may be divided among the libraries. For more information, see "Libraries with Adjusted Populations" (p. 11).

The population categories are:

- Public libraries serving populations over 5,000
- Public libraries serving populations between 2,500-4,999
- Public libraries serving populations between 1,000-2,499
- Public libraries serving populations under 1,000

Each population category contains the following charts:

- Staffing, square footage of building, hours open
- Income for the fiscal year (ending somewhere between 12/31/10 and 10/15/11)
- Expenses for the fiscal year (ending somewhere between 12/31/10 and 10/15/11)
- Holdings of books
- Holdings of other materials
- Services: hours open weekly in winter, registrations, visits, reference transactions
- Circulation and interlibrary loan
- Programming and outreach
- Computers and computer-based services

FACTS ABOUT VERMONT PUBLIC LIBRARIES, 2012

There are 183 public libraries.

- Vermont ranks first in the nation in the number of libraries per capita.
- There is also an independent bookmobile service serving two counties and one cooperative bookmobile service for a school district. Three public libraries have branches; several have bookmobiles.
- Of the total state population of approximately 625,741, 611,356, have public library service available in their towns or by contract (formal or informal) with another town's library.

MeetsStds – whether or not the library meets the minimum standards for Vermont Public Libraries in 2011.

Public Libraries serving _____ population, 2010-2011 staffing

Town in which the library is physically located (Note: it may serve more towns)

Population of town or towns served using estimated 2010 figures from U.S. Census

ALA-MLS – fulltime equivalent librarians holding a Master's degree in Library Science from a program accredited by the American Library Assn.

FTELibns – number of fulltime equivalents on staff holding title of "Librarian," whether holding an MLS degree or not.

OthStaff – number of fulltime equivalents on staff not holding title of "Librarian"

TotFTE – total fulltime equivalents, based on a 40 hour work week, on staff.

VolHrs – number of volunteer hours in a typical week.

SqFt – total square footage of library space.

Hrs/Wk – number of hours open to the public in a typical week in winter.

Town in which the library is physically located (Note: it may serve more towns)

LocalTax – local tax funds received during fiscal year. This may include funds from more than one municipality. Usually does not include in-kind support such as heat, lights, rent, etc.

StateInc – grant funds received from the Department of Libraries

OtherInc – funds received from interest on endowments and savings, fundraising, and other local sources.

Does not include in-kind support.

TotalInc – total income received from all sources including local tax, other income, and operating grants, but excludes State Income (grant funds received from the Department of Libraries).

PCTax – per capita tax support, derived by dividing Local Tax by the unduplicated population of all towns served.

Grants – total grants received, mostly for operating, from a variety of sources, including the Vermont Public Library Foundation/Freeman Foundation, Turrell Fund, Vermont Humanities Council.

Fee Rev. – total revenue from non-resident borrowers' fees, if charged

Public libraries serving _____ population, 2010-2011 expenses

Town in which library is physically located.

Salaries – amount spent on staff salaries during fiscal year.

EmpBen – amount spent on employee benefits such as social security, health insurance, retirement, etc. In some cases, tax funds spent on behalf of the library for employee benefits may not be included if they do not come out of the library's operating budget, although every attempt has been made to capture this data.

TotStExp – total staff expenditure, including salaries and employee benefits.

CollExp – amount spent on materials in collection, including books, magazines, audio visual items, electronic materials, etc.

OthExp – other library operating expenses such as utilities, programming, publicity, building maintenance, etc. Does not include capital expenses.

TotExp – total operating expenditures. Does not include capital expenses.

PCTotExp – total operating expenditures per capita, derived by dividing Total Expenditure by the unduplicated population of all towns served.

Capital - capital outlay, usually one-time expenses for building renovation or expansion

Town in which library is physically located

CollExp – amount spent on materials in collection, including books, magazines, audio visual items, electronic materials, etc.

PCCollnExp – per capita collection expenditure, derived by dividing CollExp by the unduplicated Population of all towns served.

AdBks – number of adult books (volumes) owned.

JuvBks – number of juvenile (children’s) books owned.

Books – total number of books (volumes) owned

PCVols – volumes of books owned per capita, derived by dividing Books by the unduplicated Population of all towns served.

Public libraries serving _____ population, 2010-2011 other holdings

Town in which the library is physically located.

Audio – total number of audio items owned.

Video – total number of video items owned.

ElecForm – total number of items in electronic format (CD-ROM, computer diskette, etc.) owned for all ages.

AdSubs – number of adult magazine subscriptions received, both purchased and as gifts.

JSubs – number of juvenile magazine subscriptions received, both purchased and as gifts.

Subscrip – total number of magazine subscriptions received, both purchased and as gifts.

Total holdings – total number of all items owned, regardless of format, including books from book holdings.

Public libraries serving _____ population, 2010-2011 services

Town in which the library is physically located.

Hrs/Wk – hours open weekly in winter

AdBorr – number of adults registered as borrowers

JBorr – number of children (0-14) registered as borrowers

RegBorr – total number of people registered as borrowers.

%RegBorr – percentage of population registered as borrowers, derived by dividing RegBorr by the unduplicated Population of all towns served, and multiplying by 100. Libraries are asked not to supply these numbers if files have not been purged in the last five years.

Visits – total number of people visiting the library for any reason during the year. Many libraries collect this data using a sampling method.

PCVisits – visits per capita, derived by dividing Visits by the unduplicated Population of all towns served.

RefTrans – total number of reference transactions during the year. Many libraries collect this data using a sampling method. A “reference transaction” is defined as an information contact involving the knowledge, use, recommendations, interpretation, or instruction in the use of one or more information sources by a member of the library staff.

PCRef? – reference transactions per capita, derived by dividing RefTrans by the unduplicated Population of all towns served.

Public libraries serving _____ population, 2010-2011 circulation

Hrs/Wk – hours open weekly in winter

AdCirc – number of adult materials of all types circulated during the year.

ChilCirc – number of juvenile (children’s) materials of all types circulated during the year.

TotCirc – total number of materials of all types circulated during the year.

PCCirc – per capita circulation, derived by dividing Circ by the unduplicated Population of all towns served.

Turnover—Turnover rate, the average numbers of times an item circulated during the year

ILLTo – number of items provided on interlibrary loan to other libraries.

ILLRec – number of items received on interlibrary loans from other libraries, including the Department of Libraries, other public libraries, and school, college, and special libraries nationwide. Does not include bulk loans from the Department of Libraries.

Public libraries serving _____ population, 2010-2011 programs and outreach

#AdProg – number of programs aimed primarily at adults and sponsored by the library.

#Jprog – number of programs aimed primarily at children and sponsored by the library. Weekly storyhours or any series of programs are counted as separate programs. Young adult programs are counted in this element.

#Progs – total number of programs for all audiences.

AProgAtt – number of people who attended adult programs during the year.

JProgAtt – number of people who attended children's programs during the year. This can include adults who attended children's programs. Young adult program attendance is counted in this element.

ProgAtt – total program attendance.

HomeDel – number of deliveries made to individuals' homes during the year.

DayCDel – number of deliveries made to day care providers during the year.

OtherDel – number of deliveries made to other sites such as senior meal sites, recreation programs, bookmobile stops, swimming pools, etc. during the year.

Public libraries serving _____ population, 2010-2011 computer services

#PCs – number of personal computers owned by the library.

#PubPCs – number of personal computers owned and available for public use. This may include computers that are also used by staff.

Type/Access – Type of internet access: Dial up, High Speed (DSL, cable, etc.), Not Applicable

ElecUsers/Wk – number of people using the library's computer resources (e.g., internet access, public access computers, CD-ROMs, online catalog) during a typical week

#Trained – number of staff and members of the public trained to use the library's computer resources during the year.

Filters? – Is Internet access filtered: yes, no, children's access only, unknown

Data elements that were not reported by a library show as **N/A**

Libraries with adjusted populations, 2010-2011

Populations served reflect the 2010 Census conducted by the US Census Bureau (available at <http://factfinder2.census.gov/faces/tableservices/jsf/pages/productview.xhtml?src=bkmk>). Many public libraries exclusively serve the town or city in which they are located. Others serve more than one town, and the populations are added together to obtain the population served. This is the case with Barre City and Town, Jericho and Underhill, Newport City and Town, and St. Albans City and Town. In Essex, the total town population is included for the Essex Free Library. The Brownell Library in Essex Junction uses only the official population for the village of Essex Junction.

Several public libraries receive appropriations from neighboring towns annually. Some added supporting towns and some lost them in the past year, and the populations served have been adjusted to reflect increases or decreases.

Libraries with adjusted populations include:

Arlington (2,317) + Sandgate (405) + Sunderland (956) = 3,678

Barre City (9,052) + Barre Town (7,924) = 16,976

Barton (2,810) There are two libraries in the Town These are located in two incorporated villages, Barton Village (737) and Orleans Village (818). Each library is credited with the entire village population within which it is located. One half of the town population located outside the incorporated villages and one half of the Town of Westmore (312) is credited to each library.

The population of the Town of Brownington (856) is only added to the Orleans Village library.

Barton Village (737) + 1/2 of (Barton Town(2,810)-Barton Village(737)-Orleans Village(818)) + 1/2 Westmore(350) = 1,540

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING POPULATIONS OVER 5,000

There are 31 libraries in library service areas having populations over 5,000. 17% of the libraries in the state fall into this category. Statistics for branch libraries in East Barre, East Middlebury, and Hartford/Wilder are also included with those of libraries in Barre, Middlebury, and Hartford/Quechee respectively. Statistics for the bookmobiles serving Franklin-Grand Isle and Windham Counties, which have populations in excess of 5000, are not included. Several larger libraries serve more than one town, and the unduplicated populations of all of the towns providing tax support are included as the population served and are used for calculating per capita values. The South Burlington Community Library is a “community library” serving as both public and high school library.

Some significant facts:

- These libraries serve 334,722 people. 53.49% of Vermonters live within these library service areas.
- These libraries are open a total of 1,326.3 hours a week, which represents 27.66% of the total time libraries are open in the State as a whole
- There are the equivalent of 101.04 full time librarians working in these libraries, which represents 41.65% of the librarian time spent in the entire State.
- Volunteers give 1,333.1 hours of their time to these libraries, 38.81% of all the volunteer hours donated to libraries in the State.
- These libraries received a total of \$10,537,377 in tax support from their Towns. This is 64.04% of the total tax revenues provided all the libraries in the State.
- These libraries raised another \$1,425,917 in other funds, whether through fundraisers, donations, investment income or other forms of giving. This represents 43.51% of the Statewide total and means that they took it upon themselves to raise an additional 13.53% of their funds beyond the tax revenues supplied.
- These libraries account for approximately \$12,775,619 or 60.43% of funds spent by libraries in the State.
- 1,439,135 or 45.24% of the items owned by Vermont public libraries are held in these libraries.
- There were 2,393,820 visits (64.83% of statewide visits) to these public libraries. These libraries also account for 3,136,873 or 64.89% of the items circulated in the State.
- In 2010-2011 these libraries held 9,485 programs, at which there were 199,124 attendees. Statewide, this represents 45.22% of the programs and 56.44% of the attendance.
- 28 of these libraries report a subscription to the Vermont Online Library.
- 29 of these libraries report providing wireless access.

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING POPULATIONS BETWEEN 2,500 AND 4,999

There are 41 libraries serving populations between 2,500 and 4,999 in Vermont. 22% of the libraries in the state fall into this category. The Fairfax Community Library is a "community" library, serving as both a public and a school library.

Some significant facts:

- 132,591 (21.19%) of Vermonters live within these library service areas.
- These libraries are open a total of 1,365.2 hours a week, which represents 28.47% of the total time libraries are open in the State as a whole
- There are the equivalent of 45.63 full time librarians working in these libraries, which represents 18.81% of the librarian time spent in the entire State.
- Volunteers give 778.5 hours of their time to these libraries, 22.67% of all the volunteer hours donated to libraries in the State.
- These libraries received a total of \$3,235,088 in tax support from their Towns. This is 19.66% of the total tax revenues provided all the libraries in the State.
- These libraries raised another \$855,801 in other funds, whether through fundraisers, donations, investment income or other forms of giving. This represents 26.11% of the Statewide total and means that they took it upon themselves to raise an additional 26.45% of their funds beyond the tax revenues supplied.
- These libraries account for approximately \$4,305,029 or 20.36% of funds spent by libraries in the State.
- 777,696 or 24.45% of the items owned by Vermont public libraries are held in these libraries.
- There were 677,924 (18.36% of the statewide total) visits to these public libraries. These libraries also account for 978,178 (20.23%) of the items being circulated in the State.
- In 2010-2011 these libraries held 4,847 programs, at which there were 70,806 attendees. Statewide, this represents 23.11% of the programs and 20.07% of the attendance.
- 36 of these libraries report a subscription to the Vermont Online Library.
- 39 of these libraries report providing wireless access.

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING POPULATIONS BETWEEN 1,000 AND 2,499

There are 76 libraries serving populations between 1,000 and 2,499 in Vermont. 42% of the libraries in the state fall into this category. Chittenden Public, South Hero Community and G.M. Kelly Community Libraries are “community libraries” serving as both public and school libraries.

Some significant facts:

- 112,256 (17.94%) of Vermonters live within these library service areas.
- These libraries are open a total of 1,647.1 hours a week, which represents 34.35% of the total time libraries are open in the State as a whole
- There are the equivalent of 40.24 full time librarians working in these libraries, which represents 16.59% of the librarian time spent in the entire State.
- Volunteers give 998.4 hours of their time to these libraries, 29.07% of all the volunteer hours donated to libraries in the State.
- These libraries received a total of \$2,024,203 in tax support from their Towns. This is 12.30% of the total tax revenues provided all the libraries in the State.
- These libraries raised another \$744,429 in other funds, whether through fundraisers, donations, investment income or other forms of giving. This represents 22.71% of the Statewide total and means that they took it upon themselves to raise an additional 36.78% of their funds beyond the tax revenues supplied.
- These libraries account for approximately \$3,172,970 or 15.01% of funds spent by libraries in the State.
- 785,887 or 24.71% of the items owned by Vermont public libraries are held in these libraries.
- There were 495,612 (13.42% statewide) visits to these public libraries. These libraries also account for 572,669 (11.85%) of the items being circulated in the State.
- In 2010-2011 these libraries held 5,500 programs, at which there were 65,371 attendees. Statewide, this represents 26.22% of the programs and 18.53% of the attendance.
- 38 of these libraries report a subscription to the Vermont Online Library.
- 64 of these libraries report providing wireless access.

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING POPULATIONS UNDER 1,000

There are 35 libraries serving towns with populations under 1,000 in Vermont. 19% of the libraries in the state fall into this category. Only 28 of these libraries report any information to the Department of Libraries, however. Several libraries in this population range serve seasonal populations (e.g., Greensboro, Middletown Springs, North Hero, Peacham) which makes their populations swell far beyond 1,000 at certain times of the year and may account for their proportionally higher numbers. Lowell Community, Stamford Community, Vershire Community, Walden Community and Woodbury Community Libraries are “community libraries” serving as both public and school libraries.

Some significant facts:

- 24,977 (3.99%) of Vermonters live within these library service areas.
- These libraries are open a total of 474.1 hours a week, which represents 9.89% of the total time libraries are open in the State as a whole
- There are the equivalent of 37.81 full time librarians working in these libraries, which represents 15.59% of the librarian time spent in the entire State.
- Volunteers give 324.6 hours of their time to these libraries, 9.45% of all the volunteer hours donated to libraries in the State.
- These libraries received a total of \$652,692 in tax support from their Towns. This is 3.97% of the total tax revenues provided all the libraries in the State.
- These libraries raised another \$205,237 in other funds, whether through fundraisers, donations, investment income or other forms of giving. This represents 6.26% of the Statewide total and means that they took it upon themselves to raise an additional 31.44% of their funds beyond the tax revenues supplied.
- These libraries account for approximately \$885,885 or 4.19% of funds spent by libraries in the State.
- 188,332 or 5.92% of the items owned by Vermont public libraries are held in these libraries.
- There were 125,216 (3.39% statewide) visits to these public libraries. These libraries also account for 145,434 (3.01%) items being circulated in the State.
- In 2010-2011 these libraries held 1,143 programs, at which there were 17,491 attendees. Statewide, this represents 5.45% of the programs and 4.96% of the attendance.
- 16 of these libraries report a subscription to the Vermont Online Library
- 24 of these libraries report providing wireless access.
