


Inclusive Library Services


- Terminology
 - Inclusive services: Inclusive library services are holistic, spanning library policies, collections, space, and services. Inclusive services reflect equity and accessibility for all members of the community by intentionally developing and delivering services to individuals or groups for whom accessing and using the library is difficult, limited, or minimized.
 - Accessible services: Library services that are accessible to people with disabilities

VT Disability and Health State Profile (Adults)





Percentage of adults in Vermont with select functional disability types





National comparison







Children and young adults with disabilities

- 13,793 Vermont youth ages 5 through 21 have Individual Education Plans (17% of all students enrolled in public schools)
- Vermont's total public school enrollment was 80,692 students in school year 2021-2022.



National comparison


- 7.2 million people ages 3 through 21 have Individual Education Plans (15% of total public school enrollment).
- Total public school enrollment across the country was 49.4 million students in school year 2019-2020.

Centralized library services provided by other states

- ASL and TTY reference services and collections for deaf and hard of hearing individuals.
- Books by mail for people with mobility disabilities.
- Collections and library services specific to people with cognitive disabilities and learning differences.
- Collections and library services specific to people with mental health disabilities.



Groups underserved by libraries

- People in poverty: 66,648 people (10.3%)
- Vermonters aged 65 and up: 133,295 people (20.6%)
- BIPOC: 53,059 people (8.2%)
- Veterans: 34,347 people (5.3%)
- LGBTQ+: 33,647 people (5.2%)
- New Americans: 28,471 people (4.4%) were born in other countries



National comparison

- People in poverty: 38,515,660 people (11.6%)
- People aged 65 and up: 55,781,301 people (16.8%)
- BIPOC: 62,753,964 people (18.9%)
- Veterans: 17,431,290 people (5.2%)
- LGBTQ+: 14,941,420 people (4.5%)
- New Americans: 45,156,291 people (13.6%) were born in other countries



Groups underserved by libraries (cont'd)

- Homeschoolers
- People with substance use disorders
- Members of religious minorities
- Homebound individuals
- People experiencing homelessness
- People living in rural areas
- Incarcerated individuals



Library services in state correctional facilities

- Outlined in VT Statutes (§605.6)
- Total incarcerated population (Jan. 20, 2023) 1,351
- 6 correctional facilities
- 4,077 of books distributed between correctional facilities last year
- \$36,000 current annual allocation for library services



Library services in mental health facilities

- Outlined in VT Statutes (§605.6)
- Total number of beds: 32 beds (10 to be added)
- 2 mental health facilities
- Purchased 598 number of books last year
- \$3,000 current annual allocation for library services




Services to New Americans

- Over 8,000 refugees in VT (estimate)
- 5.5% of Vermonters speak a language other than English
- Welcoming Library kits
- Translated "What is a public library" document
- Webpage with resources for libraries



Linguistic isolation in VT

- 8,541 people in VT speak English "less than very well" (1% of total population)
- 25,148,900 people in the US speak English "less than very well" (8% of the total population).





Language access needs in libraries

- Translation services
- Interpretation services
- Collections in other languages (and access to expertise in collection development in other languages)
- Library programs to support people with "limited English proficiency"



Examples of best practices in libraries

- ESL classes, citizenship classes, conversation classes
- Partnerships with food pantries
- Providing specific information for a group (ex. veterans)
- Offering programming and resources for a group (ex. home schoolers)
- Book delivery services (books by mail, bookmobile, etc.)
- Collection audits and development for diversity
- Outreach to different communities
- Focus groups to learn directly from the community about their needs
